

In 1570 Warden complain he have not our quarters sermons altho M^r Thomas White did not receive the Communion with him this yere. It also appeared at the B^{is}h^{op}s Visitation that the Rector did not live in his parson and that no Curate was licensed.

In 1573 the R. commenced a suit against Agrees Cragge for withholding tithes, but the B^{is}h^{op} withdrew the case to his own cognizance p us further particulars are forthcoming regarding it.

Thomas Smythe of Trunwell, and Henry Lancton of Great Casterton witnesses present, bear out these statements
