1574 Thomas Gee, R. of Lindou, presented that he keepeth a woman in his house to the offence of divers, and kepeth an ale house in his parsonage and also for that he delewith the stocks of a child from a poore woman his sister who haith brought upp the same child ever sithence yt were borne for the space of this dozen yeres.

- 4^o He mayed eth as occasion permitteth to keep y^e and to lett parte of y^e
- 5^o (He has executed no bond regarding the benefice)
- 6^o The livery is worth vi^e xvij^s ~~or 20 marks~~ in the Queen's Books
