

Lindou.

1574 Thomas Gee, R. of Lindou, presented that he keepeth a woman in his house to the offence of divers, and kepeth an ale house in his parsonage and also for that he delewith the stocks of a child from a poore woman his sister who haith brought upp the same child ever sithence yt were borne for the space of this dozen yeres.
