

Egleton

No record of any priest in charge of this chapelry during Thickpenny's vicariate.

- 1576 ND In 1576 Francis Prat did abuse the V. [Vicar] of O. [Oakham] with evell [evil] words: viz, saying yt [that] yf [if] all covetousness were lost yt [it] wold [would] be found in you prestes [priests] - in chiding and disdainful wise in the chancell at Egleton.
Thos Ashbrooke is a laieman [layman] and serveth ye cure there and he doth service on the sabothe [sabbath] day only and not on the weekdays and he hath professed to administer the Comm [Communion] at Eg [Egleton], and they have the Comm. [Communion] ministered but once a year unto them and at that time every one useth to receive and they knowe none but wolde [would] receive often yf [if] yt [it] were offener ministered unto them.
T.A. [Thos Ashbrooke] appeared and showed a licence to serve the Curacy in the absence of the V. of O. [Vicar of Oakham] granted by Edward Bp. of Pet. [Bishop of Peterborough] - as regards the Communion, he has only done it in aid of the V. [Vicar] on account of the number of Communicants 'about 50'. T.A. [Thos Ashbrooke] is warned not to administer sacraments or sacramentals and the V. of O. [Vicar of Oakham] is ordered to celebrate 4 times a yere.
- 1535 ND Thos Ashbrooke is relicenced as a reader.
- 1586 ND They knowe not whether Thos Ashbrooke be tolerated to read or not. They have not their quarter sermons. The Vicar letteth his benefice and there is an ale house kept upon it.
- 1592 ND Mrs Emma Herbottell did not receive the Comm [Communion] according to my Lord Bp's [Bishop's] appointment so she is cited to Peterborough - but the case was deferred.
(In the margin). The name of Thos Ashbrooke occurs in 1585 as a Schoolmaster (prob Usher) at Oakham.
- 1613 Oct 1 Francis Frost for taking away a piece of tymber ordeyned for the repair of our parish church - certified that it is restored again.
- 1614 Oct 12 They want Mr Jewells works.
- 1618 Apr 29 The churchyard wall is out of repair in default of Xfer [Christopher] Fardle.
- 1620 Nov 27 Edward Harbottle jun. for being drunke in the home of Robt. Dickens of E. [Egleton] as the fame goeth And for brawlinge with our Brewsters son of Brooke upon the 26th of March last past beinge Sabaothe [Sabbath] Day in the time of eveninge prayer as the fame also Goethe. Anthony Brewster of Brook, Thomas Weston son of Weston of Brooke. They did quarrel & fight together in prayers time. Robt Dickens for having disorder in his house: the sd [said] parties were drunke in his house.

- 1621 Dec 14 Thomas Harbottle to pay assessment of 3s 8d.
- 1622 May 8 Joh Connington * for not payeing of a levy of 7s 6d towards the repayre of the church.
- 1621 Oct 26 Edward Harbottle for not payeing of his monie to the reparaire of the church. Also Zacharia Seaton. Thomas Moysey a Shepherd: also *simlr. [similar]*. Zacharia Seaton did upon a Sunday morninge aboute a month before Michaelmas last carry his hurdles in his cart to shifte his sheepefoldes [sheepfolds].
- 1626 Oct 26 Thos Lubbenham for not payeing of a levy of 3d to th use of the church & for revilinge the Chuchwardens when they came to him to demand *yt. [it]*.
- 1628 Apr 29 Thomas Marson for not cominge to Church for this month last past and for frequentinge of alehouses & beinge drunke in the ale house in dyvine service time.
- Feb 19 Gervase Jackson & Elizab. Stacy. *F. [Fornication]*.
- 1632 Oct 30 Edward Hutchinson for not paying his dues to the church beinge ijs. Robert Towell for as usual sleped in the church in the tyme of divyne service and sermon.
- Nov 22 The church wanteth whiteinge & paintinge.
- Feb 26 Exec. of Robt Towell to administer.
- 1635 Dec 1 Sackery Seaton & James his son for (*leaving ? leasing ?*) his own Chappell when he hath had both divine service and sermon at home.
- (In the margin. 'these belong to Okeham' - referring to the following 1635 items).
- James Sharpe for keepinge company in his house in tyme of divine service. Wilton Bringe for beinge absent from divine service and usually cominge late and not rising (?) at *Gloria deo patrie* (etc ?). Thomas Moysey for absenting himself from divine service and from the blessed sacrament of the Lord's Supper. Margaret Hubbard, widow, for seldom cominge to divine service.
- Dec 1 Wm Corner & Barbara his wife of Egleton *A.N.F. [Ante Nuptial Fornication]*.
- 1636 May 12 Elizabeth Harbottle *dr [daughter]* of Mr Thomas *H. [Harbottle]* of *Eg. [Egleton]* for beinge with a child out of marriage but by whom we know not, we present this as a fame.
- Jun 1 Wm Forman, he did work all day upon Holy Thursday last past & doth commonly work upon all holidiaies. * Forman dwelling in the home of one of the churchwardens there.

1540	Jul 8	Will of Thomas Sharpe. Northton [Northampton ?] G 23:- chyd [churchyard] of St Edmond - the bells - the sepulchre light - hie altar - Thomas Kelza, cap - Wm Wryght, cap.
1570	ND	Richard Seaton thinks that "Ellen Miles is gotte with childe per quem ignoratum". Cunnington & Longford think Fall to be cited as he is believed to be the father (Fine 8s) (see Ashwell).
1612	Feb 5	Maria Cam is presented upon a fame of being with childe.
1614	Apr 15	John Harbottle, gen: That he obteyned a lycense to marry from the Reverend Father in God the Lord Bishop of Peterborough to marry with Elizabeth Godwin and to the effect that he had the consent of her father but he had not J.H. [John Harbottle] admits that he obtained a lycense to the said office but had the consent of his wives father to the said marriage - to produce a certificate that he gave his consent. Elizabeth Godwin is likewise accused.

1614	May 18	Wardens present bill & pay 6s 10d.
1592	Jun 20	Edward Harbottle & his wife for incontinence bef. [before] marr. [marriage]. Pay 7s.
	Sep 19	Mrs Em. Herbertel did not receive accordinge to my Lord Bishope's appointment.
	Oct 5	Mrs Herbertoll cited on Oct 23 for not communicating. Nov 15 deferred.
1619	May 29	Abraham Sharpe & his wife to certify regarding their penance: June 22 to pay fee, & July 9, & 23 July.
1620	Feb	Edward Harbottle: pen [penance] not certy. [certified]. Also on Feb 22.
1618	Jan	Executors of Parker to prove will: & Feb 16: & Mar 9.
1619	Apr 13	Exec. [Executors] of Parker
	May 11	Abraham Sharpe & Katherine his wife.
1599	May 10	There are divers wh. [who] have not recd. [received] the Coion [Communion] this Easter.
1588		30 Eliz. par 4. P.R. Egleton m (?) in OK, [Oakham] par. [parish]. Symingthwaite leased it to Will Geffreyson omnia terr. servie al ibn prell poss Auth. Browne mil - granted to Robert Dalyson. 2 Virgat terr cu plur jac ibn au leu Robt Harebottell pcell m (?) ibn pcell poss & pquisil de Aut Browne mil demise Edm Goodwin granted to William Fishe (P.R. 30 Eliz. p. 10,)

1586	Feb 11	Thos. Ashbrooke, they knowe not whether he be tolerated to read or not. They have not their quarter sermons. The Vicar letteth his benefice & there is an ale house kept upon it: & (Thos Ashbrooke, lector) '85 Oct 2.
1580 circ	ND	Bills & Aus Exch. K. R. 8. Edw, Harbottle of Egleton vers. [versus] E. Burton. Jerem. Warde vers [versus] Rich. & Robt. Warde of Egleton (sim. 11 Rutl).
1635	Jun 25	Par. [Parish] clk. [clerk] not allowed by the Bp. [Bishop].
1610	Nov 29	Hy [Henry] Ovington for brawlinge in the church: he did strike Christopher Fardle in the church violently with a piece of leade being about their accompts.
1611	Nov 8	Joh Ovington for not payinge his dues towards the Church. William Woodworth for not payinge his dues towards the Church, & soe beinge absent in prayers time.
1612	Jun 13	Wm Peachie V. of O. [Vicar of Oakham] for not preaching a sermon every month according to the Canon & for not having our divine service in due time upon the sabothe [sabbath] day. P. [Peachie] is monished to read divine service at tymes convenient or by his curate.
	Jul 1	W. [Wm] P. [Peachie] to read these prayers in due tyme.
1613	Oct 1	W. [Wm] P, [Peachie], V. of Ok. [Vicar of Oakham] for not catarchising [catechising].
