On Monday 6 June in the year of our Lord 1570  
before M<sup>r</sup> Edward Wilkinson p Martin -- Cox in a court  
held at Northham on the same day in the parish church there

lordship the Bp. of Peterborough and debated by his lordship for  
the particular business.
