- 1633 Mar 6. Joh Bucke gen for small absence from the church taking his journey
 some where on Sondays and sold my share once in a month covering to our
 Church: J. B. sd that he is no pastor there but only a Sotior, & will contribute double there
 Simon Bucke for rayling against M^r Craddocke & wishing him with
 vile termes threatening & defaming him on the highway to Stamford
 Francis Parkes for rayling against M^r Craddocke parson there
 & defaming him. F. P. admitted saying that he told one M^r Smith that
 one Skillington said that the sd M^r Craddocke said he would put the
 sd Parkes off from his bargain by any fraudulent means that he
 could.

Edmund Gilby, Gard. for neglect of his office in divers particulars -
 They have no booke of Homilies in the church neither did he present the
 way of the Sacra, but saith he did not know of the want thereof at the
 time of the present ment making.
