Francis Parkes for rayling against M<sup>r</sup> Craddocke parson there

John Cruickshank, Thomas Broomby think that

Christopher Broughton, 40 yrs of age, gave evidence regarding the  
validity of the will of the late William Waller of T.; C.B. had lived  
in T. all his life "Above a six weeks now past what daie he doth  
not remember he and one Syr Henry Jenkinson curat at Thrusketon  
"aforsaid being together were desired by the wyfe of the sayde William  
"nowe deceased to come and speake with her husband And so he did  
"at whiche tyme this deponent saith he harde the saide William  
"Waller saie that he woulde gyve Mariou his wyf all his goods  
"that he had and said that yf it had beene wise as much as  
"yf was he could have found it in his herte to have to gyve yt  
"to you and so did dysier this deponent and the Saide Syr Henry  
"to wyhesse the same."

order prescribed in the booke of Common Prayer.

M<sup>r</sup> C. is admonished that from henceforth he observe his Ma-  
-jesty's late injunctions concerning his afternoon sermons: and he do  
read prayers after the sermons according to the said form prescribed  
viz: the prayer for Christ Militant Church, etc.

M<sup>r</sup> C also confesses that the glebe lands in one of the fields  
belonging to the said Rectory are alienated by inclosure without the  
consent and approbation of his Ordinary: he is therfore suspended  
until the Feast of St John Baptist. Meanwhile a Commission is  
appointed to inquire into this matter.
